

Ring-fenced funding for PE and sport to continue for 2022-23. Schools to receive £16,000 + £10 per pupil next academic year

With a [recent report](#) stating that the PE and sport premium had failed to have the intended legacy, there has never been a more strategic need to focus on exactly how you will sustain the legacy of this funding in YOUR primary school.



£2.2bn has been invested in PE and school sport over the past six years and with the news that the current level of funding is due to continue for the new academic year schools will be considering how best to utilise the funding to sustain high-quality PE, school sport and physical activity (PESSPA).

Together with other national organisations and providers in the sector we want to work with schools to empower them to sustain PESSPA into the future, a future potentially that no longer relies upon the premium investment. We urge schools to look at creating a legacy of teachers who 'have high levels of subject and pedagogical knowledge' so that 'pupils are supported to know more and do more' and that 'All pupils benefit from high-quality instruction, practise and feedback' (Ofsted Subject Review 2022).

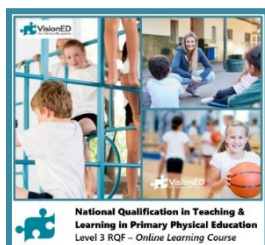
